

# Devon Orienteering Club Chairman's Annual Report 2016-17

**Highlights** (recognising that any list can only provide a flavour of the year as a whole)

- Thirteen club events have been provided across the year, each of which were open to all club members, supported by a wide range of volunteers and officials.
- Devon now has four club members ranked in the top 100 nationally: Jamie Parkinson (M21), Ben Chesters (M35), Duncan Taylor (M21) and Grey Grierson (M20).
- Approximately 450 different individuals took part in Devon's nine League events, many of whom did so on multiple occasions.
- Nine Devon juniors were selected to represent the South-West in the national Junior Inter-Regional Championships.
- Jamie Parkinson, M21 and Rob Parkinson, M60 have been selected to run in the Home Internationals in September 2017.

- Tom Lillicrap, Devon, is the M70 British Orienteering Champion 2017.
- Devon Juniors were well represented at the World Schools' Orienteering Championships in Palermo, Sicily and collected two silver medals.
- The club won through to the finals of the CompassSport Cup competition to be hosted by Devon in October 2017.
- Tom Perry (M12), Flurry Grierson (M14) and Carol Pearce (W70) are all Southern Champions following their performances at the November Classic.



### **Finances**

 The club is in a strong position financially, all events have achieved a surplus, there is continued scope to invest in mapping, equipment and the development of individuals' talent and expertise and the club has a sensible level of reserves to cope with cashflow and the unexpected. - Event Safety Workshops and training for Controllers and other officials have been provided. In total 52 club members have now attended an Event Safety Workshop.
- Work has taken place to update the map and Permanent Orienteering Course at Haldon, primarily funded by the Forestry Commission.
- The committee has reviewed our O-Safe practices and procedures and consider them sound.
- There has been a continued focus on ensuring we can communicate effectively with club members.
- I would like to take this opportunity to thank Sue Hateley for her extended role as Editor of Devon's Newsletter. In place of the Newsletter we will have more frequent event reports and associated items on the website and on Devon's Facebook page.

- The club has provided support for juniors to attend summer talent camps.
- It is sad to report the recent passing of club members, including Peter Flick, a previous Chairman and Secretary of the club.
