

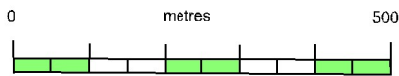

**Course Yellow, Length 1.5 km, Climb 25 m**

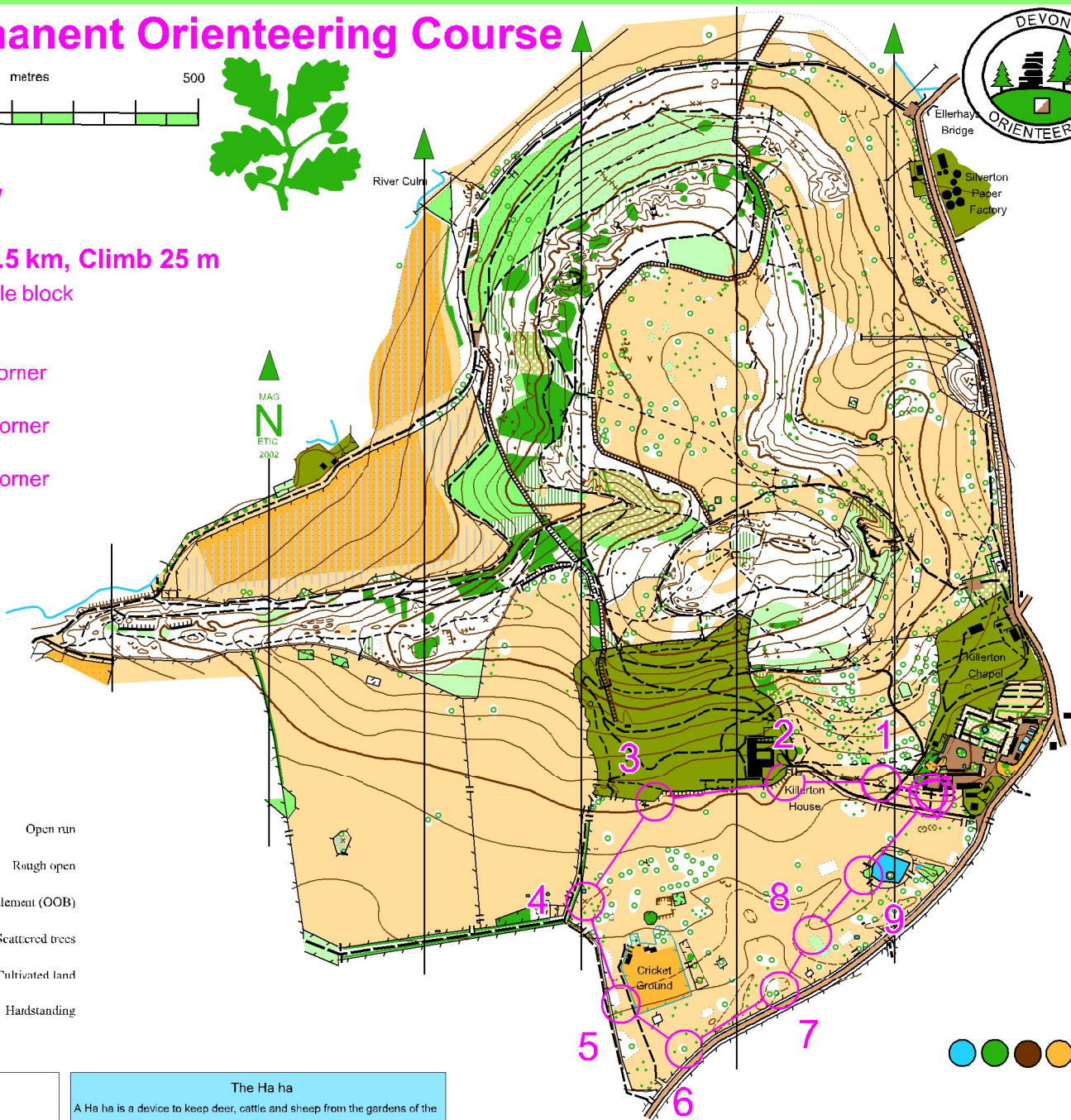
Start Path crossing, outside stable block

**The Ha ha**  
A Ha ha is a device to keep deer, cattle and sheep from the gardens of the house. It consists of a buried wall or crag with a deep gully. This also enables the residents to view the surrounding area without an intervening wall or fence. It is marked by a crag symbol with a parallel gully. Much of the gully has a good path in it. This has been omitted for clarity.

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
